From the Pastor: A Church for the Whole Community

We pride ourselves at Harbor Church on being a church for the whole community, not just an institution that exists to serve its members. Three quick thoughts about this:

A week in the life. Consider the week of May 12-19. It began with Billy Collins and Coleman Barks speaking at two large events in our sanctuary. No sooner had the poets left the island than a group of 25 guests from New York City arrived—16 eighth graders with staff from Project Reach. They had a welcome cookout at the church Tuesday, and Wednesday hung out in the Rec Center with Island youth while a dress rehearsal of a play was going on upstairs. Then we hosted three performances of “*I Hate Shakespeare*” starring Island kids, including weeks of rehearsals, which took over the church building. Saturday morning, St. Ann’s Church held their yard sale on our front lawn. In between, of course, we had worship, prayer meeting, Bible study, several AA meetings, Executive Board, bridge group, prayer shawl group, Boy Scouts, and a BIRA board meeting.

Being on mission means being open to everyone. We want to be a church that welcomes people regardless of quirks, opinions, sins, and lifestyles. Our worship can’t be just for people who “get” church, or for the tastes of a certain age group or class—just as the use of our building can’t be limited in those ways. Our mission from Jesus is to be friends to all, including those others may shut out.

Being a church for the community requires members to serve and to reach out. It won’t work for our building to be on mission all week long and have the members serving only on Sunday morning. We need—and the Spirit desires—for every member of the church to be engaged in ministry to the community. No one ever has the right to retire from Christian service; my dad, at 92, still fills in as a Sunday School teacher. No one is too old or too busy to make time for children. The Pentecost season, which lasts all summer, means that the Spirit has been given to each one of us to empower us to serve and to bear witness to Christ. Keeping your mouth shut about Jesus and the church has the same effect as keeping the doors of the church shut to the community. Let’s keep our church open, our hearts open, and our mouths open to invite our neighbors to join us.

THE AUCTION has grown into one of our major fund-raising efforts. The success depends on the participation of the members of Harbor Church and the supporting cooperation and generosity of our valued business community.

We appreciate donations from members of the community, but we should like to emphasize that in order to make an attractive offer, the auction items must have real value and use to a potential bidder.

Acceptable items include: wooden chairs, tables, bureaus and “anything” that resembles, or is, an antique. Some of the most spirited bidding has been for such items as wire clamming basket, old brass and copper kettles, old weather vanes. Art works have to be attractive, in good condition and suitably framed. Art with a Block Island theme is particularly popular. Upholstered furniture is not acceptable! History shows it doesn’t attract bidders, and we then have to dispose of it ourselves. No electronics or appliances, please.

Additionally, should you have an association with a business that might be encouraged to make a donation, please feel free to pursue it. We blanket all Island, and many local, off-Island, businesses with solicitations. Want to help with this effort? Contact the Church Office.

A major contribution to the auction has been the donation of **cottage rentals and B&Bs**. In the past, the returns from this part of the auction represented one-third of the total auction. If you have a cottage you would be willing to donate for use off-season in the spring or fall, here or elsewhere, contact the Church Office. We will provide a contract with a requirement for a security deposit. PLEASE CONSIDER THIS AN OPPORTUNITY TO MAKE A MAJOR CONTRIBUTION WITH LITTLE MORE THAN PROVIDING A WEEK OF YOUR CHOICE.

The PRC: What is it?

The quick answer is: the Pastoral Relations Committee. As prescribed by our Bylaws, the Diaconate Board is responsible for the establishment of the PRC, which consists of three members, two of whom are appointed by the deacons and one appointed by the pastor. The primary purpose of the committee is to provide a communication link between the pastor and the congregation, as well as review the pastor's compensation and benefits package each year.

When we meet, we discuss issues and matters raised by the Pastor, including expectations, disappointments, hopes and concerns. Additionally, we discuss areas of satisfaction and/or dissatisfaction with the pastor and the pastor's work which have been brought to our attention by the congregation.

Please keep in mind that we, as a committee, welcome hearing your thoughts and concerns, feelings and suggestions concerning matters relating to Pastor Relations.



MEET OUR SUMMER 2012 INTERN: **KADIN WILLIAMS**

This summer, Harbor Church will be hosting a new Summer Seminary Intern. A native of California, Kadin grew up primarily in the Central Valley of California, and as an undergraduate attended Bethany University of the Assemblies of God in Santa Cruz. There, he majored in Social Science and concentrated on History, Economics and Anthropology. Following the completion of his B.A., Kadin took some time off from school to pursue some other interests. During that period of time, he managed alumni relations for his alma mater's Social Science Department and worked as a research assistant for an academic publication. Kadin coached high school debate, filled in as a substitute teacher for an apologetics class at a local Christian School, and even delivered pizza.

Since his enrollment at Princeton Seminary, where he is pursuing a Masters of Divinity, Kadin has been working for the Bonner Foundation as a Policy Options research intern. He specializes in policies related to the environment, agriculture and natural resources. He hopes to pursue a Ph.D. in Religious and Intellectual History.

Kadin came to Christ at the age of twelve at a Baptist church in Humboldt County, CA. He was later baptized in that same church. Near the end of his sophomore year of college, he received a call to ministry. Following the call he began to take more courses in theology, biblical studies and hermeneutics. In the summer following his junior year, he served as a summer missionary for the Central Valley Baptist Association. He has also served as a Sunday school teacher, Vacation Bible School teacher, and church softball team coach.

Kadin's interests include snowboarding, fishing, disc golf, baseball, books, vinyl records, and, of course, his fiancé, Amanda Black (last summer's intern). The couple will be getting married in Tennessee on August 25, 2012.

Youth Group Missions



The Harbor Church VBS program, which had been non-active for many years, was reinitiated after Pastor Steve and Becca came to Block Island. By offering the program in the evening from 6-8:30 p.m. and serving a light supper to kids, we gave parents a few quiet hours to enjoy. The first year, 2010, brought 15-18 children to the program every day, and was wildly successful. Last year, participation increased to 20-24 children each day. We are hopeful that this trend will continue, and we will see even more children this year.

Feedback from the adults who helped with the program for the past two years has been very positive. Almost everyone who participated in the past is returning again. There is nothing so uplifting as seeing the joy on children's faces as they learn about God's love through fun activities and stories. Everyone is invited to share in this! Do you like to cook? Camp Canonicus, Here we come ... with a little help from our friends!
